




Where Did God Come from?

He was the one who made everything. He made you! He chose to create you and give you life.

In the Garden of Eden

Read about the first humans in Genesis 2:7-25.

Sin

Read about what happened in Genesis 3:1-7.


When Adam and Eve realised they had broken God's rules, they tried to hide. They covered themselves and ran away from God.

God decided to destroy these wicked people with a big flood.


But there was one man who was still faithful to God. His name was Noah. God decided to save Noah and his family.


God told Noah and his family to build a big boat.




Read about Noah in Genesis 6:9-22.

Make your own boat out of paper following the instructions:






Fold along the dotted lines

Noah and his family built a big boat, called an 'ark'. God told Noah to take two of every kind of animal on the ark with him.




When Noah and his family and all the animals were safely on the ark, God sent rain. It rained for forty days!
