


# **Activity Booklet for Children Booklet B**




## Mary and Joseph

Read the story in Luke 1:26-38.

At first Mary was worried and confused. But when she understood, she was filled with joy and sang a song of praise. Read Mary's song in Luke 1:46-56.

When Mary was happy, she sang praise to God. What songs do you like to sing when you're happy?



Read about Joseph's reaction in Matthew 1:18-24. How do you think Joseph felt when he heard the news?

### Journey to Bethlehem

The ruler of the country said that everyone had to return to their hometown to be registered. Mary and Joseph had to travel to a town called Bethlehem. It was nearly time for Mary's baby to be born, but they could find nowhere to stay. The only place for them to sleep was an animal shelter.

#### Jesus is Born



In the fields nearby there were shepherds looking after their sheep. God sent angels to tell them that a special baby had been born in an animal shelter in Bethlehem.



#### Wise Men Travel to See Jesus

In a country far away there were wise men who had heard that a special baby had been born. He was special because he would be a king. They travelled a long way to find him. They asked the King if he knew where to find this baby.

King Herod asked his advisors, and they said that the special baby had been born in Bethlehem. So, the wise men travelled to Bethlehem and found Jesus with his parents Mary and Joseph. They brought him expensive gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.



Read the story in Matthew 2:1-12.

#### **Evil King Herod**

When King Herod heard about this special baby, he was jealous. The wise men had said that Jesus would be a king. Herod was afraid that Jesus would take his place as king. He wanted to make sure that this never happened, so he sent soldiers to kill all the baby boys in the area around Bethlehem.

But God sent an angel to warn Joseph to escape to Egypt. Mary and Joseph took Jesus there and waited until it was safe to return to their home town of Nazareth.



Read the story in Matthew 2:13-23.

Write a story or a poem telling about Mary's and Joseph's experiences when they escaped to Egypt. How do you think they felt?

Jesus grew to be a happy and obedient child. Joseph taught him how to be a carpenter. Jesus loved God and helped other people all his life. Even though he was God's son, he grew and learned, just like us.
