





Jacob and Esau

Isaac grew up and married a woman named Rebekah.



Read the story of Isaac and Rebekah's sons in Genesis 25:21-34 and 27:1-45.

As the eldest son, Esau would receive everything his parents owned after they died. This was called his birthright. But Esau was so desperate to eat Jacob's stew that he traded his birthright for the food. Later, Jacob tricked their father into giving him the blessing that he was meant to give to Esau.

Sometimes when we are under pressure, we make bad choices. We can learn from our mistakes to help us make good choices.

Describe or draw a time when you made a good choice, for example, helping a friend. Share your story with a friend.

Jacob had run away in fear of his brother's anger. Read Genesis 33:1-12 to find out what happened when the two brothers saw each other again twenty years later.
